outh Strings is off to a great start.

We have 53 students in our orchestra this year. The group is made up of 38 girls and 15 boys. Twenty-eight of the students are returning players and twenty-five players are new to the orchestra. Our members range in age from 7 to 15 years, and are between Grades 3 and 11 in school. The orchestra is comprised of 46 violinists, one violist, five cellists and one bass player who doubles also as a violinist.

This year's repertoire ranges from easily manageable to quite difficult. It covers a variety of time periods and presents unique stylistic challenges for the players. The students are keen, enthusiastic and committed to learning the given repertoire, albeit a stretch for them at times. It is a real pleasure to see and hear how far the group has progressed in just such a short period of time together as a string orchestra! We will perform some of the selections at a seniors' concert at Lions Manor on Saturday, December 3rd and then again on Sunday, December 4th at the Holiday concert. Most significant for us this year is the working through of a challenging and lengthy piece commissioned specifically for our orchestra. We hope to perform the world premiere of King Arthur's Chronicles by American composer, James Thornton, at the Sounds of Spring concert next April.

Our weekend retreat at Camp Assiniboia on September 17^{th} & 18^{th} again proved to be a most successful camp experience. The camp has great facilities, accommodating our need for intensive sectional and full group rehearsals as well as providing fun recreational activities for the students. The weather was exceptionally warm for our entire stay! Horsebackriding, archery and team-building activities were a highlight! We had an evening bonfire and movie night to complete the first day. It is good to have an extended time where we can learn to know each other better as well as learn the notes! Already at the evening group rehearsal it was evident that the four clinicians had really covered an enormous amount of material in the sectionals, resulting in a better orchestra sound and more solid rhythm! Special thanks must therefore be extended to clinicians Louise Faurschou, Kristjanna Oleson and Marion Williams who helped out with the violins and Jonathan Bauch who spent the day with the cello section! Over the two days I really appreciated the ten parent volunteers who helped out in so many ways at camp. We were happy that some parents also joined us for our Sunday wagon rides.


